

Wakehurst Parkway weekend closure between Seaforth and Narrabeen from Friday 18 May to Monday 21 May 2018

The NSW Government is upgrading roads around the new Northern Beaches Hospital to increase capacity on the road network and improve access through the area.

Roads and Maritime Services is implementing a number of traffic changes at the Warringah Road and Wakehurst Parkway intersection. These changes are necessary to prepare for the next stage of road construction on Warringah Road. We will continue to provide up-to-date information about the planned work over the coming weeks.

Roads and Maritime will close Wakehurst Parkway north and south of Warringah Road to carry out to important work at this intersection. The closures will take place from **10pm on Friday 18 May** to **5am on Monday 21 May**, weather permitting.

Closure of Wakehurst Parkway north of Warringah Road to Narrabeen

Wakehurst Parkway north of Warringah Road will be closed at **Pittwater Road, Narrabeen** with access maintained for **local traffic** heading to and from North Narrabeen, Oxford Falls and Frenchs Forest.

During the closure we will move the traffic lights and change the northern side of the Wakehurst Parkway and Warringah Road intersection.

Detours will be in place for local traffic. Police will be on site to direct traffic and allow a temporary right turn from **Wakehurst Parkway** to **Frenchs Forest Road West** for traffic wanting to head towards Chatswood. Southbound traffic on Wakehurst Parkway wanting to head east to Dee Why can still turn left using the slip lane onto Warringah Road.

Closure of Wakehurst Parkway south of Warringah Road to Seaforth

Wakehurst Parkway south of Warringah Road will be closed from **Judith Street, Seaforth**. During the closure we will rebuild the southern side of the Wakehurst Parkway and Warringah Road intersection, which will become part of the new westbound lanes on Warringah Road.

The work will involve:

- installing drainage, kerbs and gutters
- removing and rebuilding the road base
- adjusting traffic signals
- laying asphalt
- line marking.

We have included a map of the traffic detours.

Further traffic changes will be required as construction continues. We will continue to provide up-to-date information, including distributing notifications about upcoming work.

Public transport changes

Route 169 buses will still run via Wakehurst Parkway. However detours will be in place in Frenchs Forest and some services may experience delays. Visit transportnsw.info or call 131 500 to plan your trip.

Traffic changes

During the closure of Wakehurst Parkway, motorists are advised to use Warringah Road, Forest Way, Pittwater Road, Mona Vale Road or the Pacific Highway as alternatives. These routes are suitable for heavy vehicles.


There will be temporary traffic changes and detours to ensure the safety of motorists, cyclists, pedestrians and workers. Electronic message signs, temporary signage and traffic controllers will alert road users to these temporary changes and detours when they are in place.

How will the work affect you?

The work will involve the use of machinery which may generate some noise. We will use noise shields to dampen noise where appropriate and ensure equipment and vehicles are turned off when not in use. We will focus lights only on the working area. However some light may spill over into some nearby homes.
