

Have your say – Proposed improvements at the Macquarie Street and Fishery Point Road intersection, Morisset

The NSW Government has committed \$150,000 this financial year to plan for safety and traffic flow improvements at this intersection.

Roads and Maritime Services is seeking your feedback on proposed improvements to the Macquarie Street and Fishery Point Road intersection at Morisset. We have included a plan to show the proposed improvements, which involve:

- Installing traffic lights at the intersection to improve safety for motorists turning left and right into Macquarie Street from Fishery Point Road and for motorists turning left and right from Macquarie Street into Fishery Point Road. The traffic lights would allow a left turn on red movement from Fishery Point Road.
- Installing a raised concrete median and line marking changes at the intersection. The raised median would improve safety for motorists by preventing vehicles from crossing to the wrong side of the road or making right turn movements into and out of property accesses in the vicinity of this very busy intersection. Access would be left in and left out only for properties located along this section of Macquarie Street.
- Road widening to provide two right turn lanes for vehicles turning into Fishery Point Road from Macquarie Street. This will require the removal of on-street parking between 42 and 56 Macquarie Street. Road widening will also be carried out on the eastern side of Fishery Point Road to allow for a second southbound lane on Fishery Point Road between Macquarie Street and Pulbah Street
- Work may also include the installation of a retaining wall on the eastern side of Fishery Point Road. We will be carrying out further investigations to determine if this part of the work is required.
