

Pedestrian safety measures to be installed on Anzac Parade, Maroubra

Release of consultation report

Transport for NSW will proceed with new pedestrian safety measures on Anzac Parade, Maroubra, after it completed an assessment of community responses to the proposed changes.

The measures, which aim to reduce or eliminate collisions involving pedestrians and motor vehicles, include the installation of a 40 metre pedestrian fence and the creation of new 'No Stopping' zone on Anzac Parade's northbound carriageway, between Maroubra and Boyce roads.

The proposed measures were issued for public comment in mid-2019. There were 15 submissions.

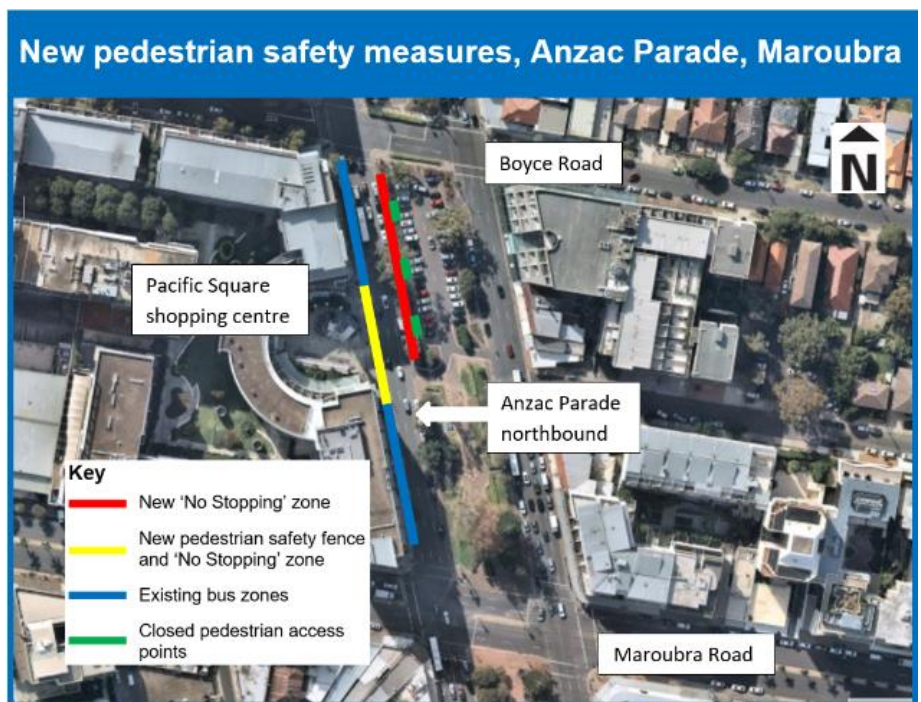
A consultation report summarising the submissions and our responses is available on the project webpage. The submissions addressed potential inconvenience to pedestrians, speed limits, loss of parking and effectiveness of the measures.

Following assessment of the public submissions, Transport for NSW will proceed with, with one change. We will undertake a speed zone review to determine the most appropriate speed limit for Anzac Parade. The review will take place after completion of the CBD and South East Light Rail project.

We will update the community again before work starts.
