

Traffic delays – New England Highway, Bolivia Hill from Monday 29 April 2019

The next stage of major work is starting on the Bolivia Hill upgrade which will make the New England Highway safer and easier to drive.

Work to improve the New England Highway at Bolivia Hill is stepping up. Work is starting on widening sections of the highway. A number of sections of the southbound lane will be excavated to allow the cutting back of the adjoining rock face.

From **Monday 29 April 2019**, barriers will be installed along the 2.6 kilometre section of the highway reducing it to one lane for 24 hours per day for up to 12 months.



Traffic impacts

- The highway will be reduced to one lane permanently for up to 12 months along the 2.6 kilometre section
- Traffic lights will be in place 24 hours per day with delays of up to 10 to 15 minutes expected. The traffic lights will be controlled to ensure vehicles at either end are not delayed unnecessarily when there are no vehicles travelling in the opposite direction.
- A reduced speed limit of 40km/hr will be in place throughout the worksite

Why do we need to do this work?

To straighten this section of the highway, major excavation of the slope adjoining the highway is needed. We will then rebuild and widen sections of the southbound lane of the highway. Work then moves to the northbound lane to backfill and widen sections of this lane.
