

# Cabarita Wharf upgrade

## What to expect during construction

Transport for New South Wales | January 2018

**The upgrade of the wharf and interchange at Cabarita will take about five to six months to complete, weather and maritime conditions permitting. Construction will start on Wednesday 14 February 2018.**

### Construction process

Work will include:

- ▶ establishing the site compound, installing fencing, site hoarding and site sheds
- ▶ modifying the existing wharf allowing ferries to operate during construction
- ▶ removing existing wharf structures that aren't being kept
- ▶ installing steel piles
- ▶ installing the new covered jetty, gangway and pontoon
- ▶ installing new seating and glass weather screening on the pontoon
- ▶ building a new kiss and ride zone
- ▶ regrading the existing path between the car park and the wharf
- ▶ upgrading the existing parking spaces
- ▶ installing new car parking spaces on Cabarita Road.

### Work hours and noise

Standard work hours will be between **7am and 6pm Monday to Friday** and between **8am and 1pm on Saturdays**. Some of the work during these times may be noisy. No work is planned on Sundays or public holidays.

Early morning and night work will be required when the water is at its calmest as some work requires very still water for safety and accuracy.

This includes the installation of piles and lifting and securing sections of the wharf into place. Installation of piles will be noisy however, this work is intermittent. We will notify nearby residents before any work is carried out outside of standard hours.

### Site compound

A temporary construction site compound will be established for the duration of the project. The location will be identified and agreed with City of Canada Bay Council before construction starts. The area will be fenced off and restricted to authorised personnel and visitors.

### Transport during construction

Ferry services will continue to operate to Cabarita during construction. The existing wharf will be modified to allow ferry access. There will be some changes to the way customers access ferries and temporary wayfinding signage will be installed.
