

Start of work on Cabbage Tree Road, Williamtown from Monday 1 June

The NSW Government is investing in essential maintenance work between Barrie Close and Nelson Bay Road to provide a stronger, longer lasting and safer road for motorists.

Port Stephens Council will deliver the work on behalf of Transport for NSW which involves rebuilding a 600 metre section of the road.

The site compound will be established from **Wednesday 27 May** with traffic changes implemented from **Monday 1 June**.

From **Monday 1 June**, we will be working between **7am** and **6pm** from **Monday** to **Saturday** and expect to complete the work in **three weeks**, weather permitting. We will let you know in advance if we need to do any work outside these times.

Traffic changes

Detours for westbound motorists will be in place 24 hours a day from Monday 1 June to Monday 15 June. The road will be open to traffic on Sunday 7 June and Monday 8 June, over the long weekend.

Westbound motorists will be detoured via either Richardson Road towards Raymond Terrace or Nelson Bay Road toward Newcastle. We have included a map to show the alternate routes.

Motorists are advised to plan ahead as the detour is expected to add up to 25 kilometres to journeys, which is about 20 minutes travel time. Access will be maintained for residents and emergency services.

Lane closures and a stop/slow traffic arrangement will be in place during work hours from Tuesday 16 May for one week.

Please keep to speed limits and follow the direction of traffic controllers and signs. For the latest traffic updates, you can call 132 701, visit livetraffic.com or download the Live Traffic NSW App.

How will the work affect you?

The work will involve the use of machinery which generates some noise. We will make every effort to minimise noise by turning off machinery and vehicles when not in use.
