

Cremorne Point Wharf upgrade

The new wharf

The existing wharf will be replaced by a completely new structure designed to provide customers with improved access and amenity.

The wharf will comprise of a steel floating pontoon, a covered concrete entry platform and a covered aluminium gangway connecting the entry platform to the pontoon. Four steel piles will hold the floating pontoon in place and the entry platform will be supported by four steel piles.

The pontoon will have a curved roof which will shelter customers from the weather. Glass screens and seating will provide improved comfort and amenity.

The new sections of the wharf will look similar to the recently upgraded wharves including Rose Bay and Balmain (Thames Street).

Accessibility for customers using mobility aids and customers with prams will be improved with the pontoon, gangway and ramp designed to meet current access standards.
