Night work and extended weekend working hours on Tourle Street and Cormorant Road, Kooragang, from Tuesday 3 October 2017

The Australian and NSW governments have each committed funding for this project to improve traffic flow and cater for future traffic growth.

Roads and Maritime Services has engaged WBHO McIlwain Joint Venture to duplicate 3.8 kilometres of Tourle Street and Cormorant Road between Industrial Drive, Mayfield West and Egret Street, Kooragang, including the construction of a second bridge over the Hunter River.

Upcoming work includes:

- removing existing line markings on the road and replacing with new line markings
- installing of medians safety barriers
- installing wire rope safety barriers
- bridge construction including delivery and installation of bridge beams, concrete pours on piers and decks at the Hunter River
- delivery of large items including bridge beams on Tourle Street and Cormorant Road
- road construction and resurfacing activities on Tourle Street and Cormorant Road
- utilities, drainage and concreting activities on Tourle Street and Cormorant Road.

To minimise traffic disruptions, some of the work will be carried out at night and outside standard working hours.

Night work will be carried out occasionally within the project area between **6pm** and **7am**, from **Tuesday 3 October** and **continue for two months**, weather permitting.

We will also be working extended weekend hours between **7am** and **6pm**, from **Saturday 7 October** to **Sunday 26 November**, weather permitting.

We will continue to deliver the majority of work between **7am** and **6pm**, from **Monday** to **Friday** , weather permitting.

No work will be carried out between Saturday 30 September and Monday 2 October inclusive.

How will this impact me?

There will be some noise associated with this work. We will make every effort to minimise noise by:

- arranging the work in stages at different locations
-

- using the minimum amount of machinery necessary and turning off the machinery when not in use
- monitoring worker behaviour to ensure noise is kept to a minimum.

Traffic changes

Temporary traffic changes will continue to be in place to ensure the work zone is safe.

Lane closures will be in place and may affect travel times. Please keep to speed limits and follow the direction of traffic controllers and signs. For the latest traffic updates, you can call 132 701, visit livetraffic.com or download the Live Traffic NSW App.
