## **Night work and extended Saturday working hours on Tourle Street and Cormorant Road, Kooragang, from Monday 3 April 2017**

**The Australian and NSW governments have each committed funding for this project to improve traffic flow and cater for future traffic growth.**

Roads and Maritime Services has engaged WBHO McIlwain Joint Venture to duplicate 3.8 kilometres of Tourle Street and Cormorant Road between Industrial Drive, Mayfield West and Egret Street, Kooragang. This work includes the construction of a second bridge over the Hunter River.

This work involves:

- removing existing line markings and concrete islands on the road and replacing with new line markings and barriers
- installation of new signage to improve safety
- bridge construction including excavation and concrete works at the Hunter River
- delivery of large equipment and materials on Tourle Street and Cormorant Road
- road surfacing activities on Tourle Street and Cormorant Road
- utilities, drainage and concreting activities on Tourle Street and Cormorant Road.

To minimise traffic disruptions, some of the work will be carried out at night and outside standard working hours.

Intermittent night work will be carried out within the project area **from Monday 3 April and continue for two months**, weather permitting. The work will be carried out **between 6pm and 7am from Sunday to Friday**.

We will also be working extended Saturday hours **between 7am and 6pm from Saturday 8 April to Wednesday 31 May**, weather permitting.

We will continue to deliver the majority of the work **between 7am and 6pm from Monday to Friday**, weather permitting.

No work will be carried out between Friday 14 April and Monday 17 April inclusive or on Tuesday 25 April.

## How will the work affect you?

The work will involve the use of machinery which may generate some noise. We will make every effort to minimise noise by:

- arranging the work in stages at different locations
- using the minimum amount of machinery necessary and turning off the machinery when not in use
- monitoring worker behaviour to ensure noise is kept to a minimum.

## Traffic changes

Temporary traffic changes will continue to be in place to ensure the work zone is safe.
