



## Night and day work on Mulgoa Road from 5 November 2018

The Australian and NSW Governments have fast-tracked \$100 million in funding to the Mulgoa Road, Jamisontown upgrade between Jeanette Street and Blaikie Road including M4 Motorway off-ramps.



### Map of the Mulgoa Road investigations

Roads and Maritime Services are currently preparing designs for the widening of Mulgoa Road to six lanes and providing active transport options. In order to complete this work, we will carry out survey of fauna and arborist assessment along the Mulgoa Road.

The investigation will be carried out for up to **15 shifts** between **Monday 5 November** and **Saturday 8 December 2018**, weather permitting.

Work during the day will occur on weekdays between **6am** and **6pm** and on Saturdays between **8am** and **1pm**.

Work at night is expected to occur on some weekdays and weekend nights, including some Saturday and Sunday nights, between **6pm** and **6am**.

## How will the work affect you?

Our work will not be particularly noisy, and every effort will be made to minimise impact on residents. Noisy activities would be limited to light vehicle access to the sites to be surveyed, access to potential nesting sites in trees by a mobile platform, and occasional conversation between workers.

## Traffic changes
