



Road work on the New England Highway, Kentucky from Monday 24 February

The NSW Government is funding improvements to the road surface and safety on the New England Highway at Kentucky, about 13 kilometres south of Uralla. The work is being funded from a range of programs, including the Safer Roads Program.

Transport for NSW will carry out the work, which will involve widening and resurfacing a six-kilometre section of road and improving drainage. The work is expected to be completed in September 2020, weather permitting. We have included a map to show the location of the work.

The work will be carried out **Monday** to **Saturday** between **7am** and **6pm**. No work will be carried out on Sundays or public holidays. We will let you know in advance if we need to do any work outside these times.

How will the work affect you?

The work will involve the use of machinery which will generate some noise. We will make every effort to minimise noise by turning machinery off when not in use and positioning machinery away from residential areas where possible.

Access to properties in the area will be maintained at all times.

Traffic changes

There will be some temporary traffic changes to ensure the safety of motorists and workers.

Traffic will be reduced to one lane, alternate flow on the New England Highway wherever work is being carried out. The project will be carried out in sections within the six-kilometre section of road being improved. A reduced speed limit will be in place during work hours and may affect travel times.
