

Northern Beaches Hospital road upgrade – Lane closures on Warringah Road from Monday 6 January

The NSW Government is upgrading roads around the Northern Beaches Hospital to increase capacity on the road network and improve access through the area.

Transport for NSW is continuing to deliver this important project with work progressing on the 1.3 kilometre long underpass in the centre of Warringah Road.

To continue this work, lane closures will take place on Warringah Road from **Monday 6 January to Monday 20 January 2020**, weather permitting.

This work will be carried out during the January school holidays. Even though weekday traffic volumes are expected to be lower than out of school holiday times, potential congestion and delays are expected on Warringah Road and other roads in the area. Road users are encouraged to plan ahead, allow extra travel time and use alternative routes. Pedestrian access will be maintained at all times. Bus operations and bus stops will not be impacted.

Traffic changes on Warringah Road

From **8pm Monday 6 January to 5am Monday 20 January**, we will make the following changes on Warringah Road:


For westbound traffic we will:

- close one westbound lane of Warringah Road from Allambie Road to Wakehurst Parkway.

For eastbound traffic we will:


- close one eastbound lane of Warringah Road from Altona Avenue to Allambie Road
- maintain the right turn at Hilmer Street and Wakehurst Parkway.

The AM arrangement for the left turn slip lane from Forest Way southbound to Warringah Road eastbound, which enables Forest Way traffic to enter Warringah Road in a dedicated lane using the movable orange posts, **will not be in operation** during this time. Forest Way traffic will merge into Warringah Road at the slip lane.

Temporary traffic changes are needed to ensure the safety of workers and road users and may affect travel times. Please keep to speed limits and follow the direction of traffic controllers and signs. What will the work involve?

Due to the narrow work area and its proximity to live traffic, these lane closures are required to ensure the safety of both the work crew and the public while we continue to construct the entry to and exit from the underpass.

The work involves:

- removing the existing road surface
- excavating the existing road surface up to one metre deep and rebuilding the road
- pouring concrete for kerbs and barriers
- temporary line marking.

How will the work affect you?

The work will involve the use of machinery which will generate some noise. We will use noise shields to reduce noise where appropriate and ensure equipment and vehicles are turned off when not in use.

The work will involve the use of machinery which may also generate vibration on occasions..

Delays may occur along Warringah Road, Forest Way and Wakehurst Parkway. Road users are encouraged to plan ahead and allow extra travel time.
