

Hilmer Street re-opens from Friday 6 October

The NSW Government is upgrading roads around the new Northern Beaches Hospital to increase capacity on the road network and improve access through the area.

Roads and Maritime Services continues to upgrade Hilmer Street as part of the Northern Beaches Hospital road upgrade project. From Friday 6 October the left turn from Warringah Road into Hilmer Street will be re-opened and Hilmer Street will return to two-way traffic flow.

However to allow for further necessary work in the area, the intersection of Hilmer Street and Warringah Road will be **temporarily closed** at Warringah Road for **three nights**. This will happen on **Monday 16 October, Tuesday 17 October, and Thursday 19 October**, between **8pm** and **6am**, weather permitting.

Hilmer Street intersection upgrade

The work will involve asphaltting. During the night work, motorists will be **unable to enter or exit Hilmer Street** from Warringah Road and will need to use alternative routes.

Recommended alternative routes including:

- to enter Hilmer Street: from Warringah Road, turn into Maxwell Parade (for both eastbound and westbound traffic)
- to exit Hilmer Street:
 - westbound traffic: travel along Fitzpatrick Avenue East, then turn left onto Warringah Road
 - eastbound traffic: travel along Fitzpatrick Avenue East, Maxwell Parade, Currie Road then turn right onto Warringah Road.

When the work is complete, all turning movements will be reinstated, allowing full access to and from Hilmer Street.

We have included a map to show the location of the night work and the traffic changes.

Traffic changes

There will be some temporary traffic changes to ensure the safety of workers, motorists, cyclists and pedestrians during the night work. Detours will be in place and may affect travel times. Pedestrian access will be maintained at all times, although minor detours may be in place during the work.

Please keep to speed limits and follow the direction of traffic controllers and signs. For the latest traffic updates, contact 132 701, visit livetraffic.com or download the Live Traffic NSW App.

How will the work affect you?

The work will involve the use of machinery which may generate some noise. We will make every effort to minimise impact by using noise shields to dampen noise where appropriate and ensure equipment and vehicles are turned off when not in use. Portable lighting will be used and we will focus lights only on the working area to minimise light spilling into nearby residences.
