

Northern Beaches Hospital road upgrade - Temporary road closure at Wakehurst Parkway from Warringah Road to Aquatic Drive from Friday 7 June 2019

The NSW Government is upgrading roads around the new Northern Beaches Hospital to increase capacity on the road network and improve access through the area

Roads and Maritime Services is upgrading Wakehurst Parkway as part of the Northern Beaches Hospital road upgrade project.

To continue this work, there will be a **full road closure** on **Wakehurst Parkway** from **Warringah Road to Aquatic Drive** over the long weekend in June for road construction work. Historical traffic data indicates that this weekend is a lower than normal traffic volume time to carry out this closure.

Potential congestion and delays are expected on Wakehurst Parkway and other roads in the area. Motorists are encouraged to plan ahead, allow extra travel time and use alternative routes. The busiest traffic times are expected to be:

- **between 10am and 3pm on Saturday 8 June**
- **between 10am and 2pm on Sunday 9 June**

Detours will be in place while we complete the work. Traffic management and signage will be in place to assist motorists through these temporary conditions.

Public Transport

Buses will run to their normal routes and stopping arrangements throughout the closure.

Emergency Vehicles

Emergency vehicle access will be available through the work area at all times during the closure.

Wakehurst Parkway closure from Friday 7 June to Tuesday 11 June 2019

From **8pm Friday 7 June** to **5am Tuesday 11 June**, all northbound and southbound lanes on **Wakehurst Parkway** will be closed between **Warringah Road** and **Aquatic Drive**.


Wakehurst Parkway south of Aquatic Drive to Seaforth will be open to northbound traffic only.

Motorists travelling northbound from Seaforth will detour via **Aquatic Drive**, **Allambie Road** to **Frenchs Forest Road East**.

Motorists travelling southbound on Wakehurst Parkway will detour via **Warringah Road** to **Pittwater Road**.

All eastbound and westbound traffic movements on **Warringah Road** will remain unchanged.

Pedestrian access will be maintained at all times, although temporary detours may be in place.

During the traffic changes the following work will take place:

- installing drainage, kerb and gutter
- constructing a concrete median
- road surfacing milling in preparation for road resurfacing, asphaltting and line marking.

How will the work affect you?

The work will involve the use of machinery which may generate some noise. We will use noise shields to dampen noise where appropriate and ensure equipment and vehicles are turned off when not in use. We will focus lights only on the working area. However, there is likely to be some spill-over of light into some nearby residences.

Traffic changes

These traffic changes are needed to upgrade the road and to ensure the safety of workers, motorists, cyclists and pedestrians and may affect travel times. Please keep to speed limits and follow the direction of traffic controllers and signs.
