

Weekend work on Wakehurst Parkway at the Warringah Road intersection from Friday 11 May to Monday 14 May 2018

The NSW Government is upgrading roads around the new Northern Beaches Hospital to increase capacity on the road network and improve access through the area.

Roads and Maritime Services will implement a number of traffic changes at the Warringah Road and Wakehurst Parkway intersection over the coming weeks. These changes are necessary to prepare for the next stage of road construction on Warringah Road. We will continue to provide up-to-date information about the planned work over the coming weeks.

Weekend of Friday 11 May to Monday 14 May

Roads and Maritime will reduce the lane capacity of Wakehurst Parkway at the Warringah Road intersection from **8pm on Friday 11 May to 5am on Monday 14 May**, weather permitting.

Traffic lights at the intersection of Wakehurst Parkway and Warringah Road will be turned off at night when traffic volumes are lower. However, motorists may still experience delays. Police will attend and control traffic during these times.

The Wakehurst Parkway and Warringah Road intersection will be reduced **to one lane in each direction** when the traffic lights are turned off at night over this weekend, weather permitting.

Changed traffic conditions from Friday 11 May to Sunday 26 May

From the evening of **Friday 11 May** through to the evening of **Saturday 26 May**, there will be reduced lane capacity for traffic heading north along Wakehurst Parkway at the left turn onto Warringah Road. Longer travel time for northbound motorists on Wakehurst Parkway is expected, especially for left turning traffic.

In addition, from the evening of **Saturday 12 May**, road users travelling west on Warringah Road wanting to turn left onto Wakehurst Parkway south will need to be in the left hand lane from Rodborough Road onwards in order to use the new left turn slip lane.

As this is a busy time on the road with Mother's Day on **Sunday 13 May**, please plan your journey ahead and allow additional extra travel time.

Please use caution when travelling through the intersection and follow police directions.


All traffic will be permitted to travel this route and no detours will be in place over this weekend. A map of the work area has been included overleaf.

The work will involve:

- adjusting traffic signals
- laying asphalt
- line marking.

Further traffic changes will be required in the area as construction continues. Notifications about the upcoming work will be distributed as required.

Traffic changes

There will be temporary traffic changes and detours to ensure the safety of motorists, cyclists, pedestrians and workers. Electronic message signs, temporary signage and traffic controllers will alert road users to these temporary changes when they are in place.

How will the work affect you?

The work will involve the use of machinery which may generate some noise. We will use noise shields to dampen noise where appropriate and ensure equipment and vehicles are turned off when not in use. We will focus lights only on the working area, however some light may spill over into some nearby homes.
