

## Weekend closure of temporary Briner Bridge on 28-29 November 2020

The NSW Government is funding this \$15.9 million rebuilding of the Briner Bridge to ensure the community has safe and reliable access for generations to come.

The original Briner Bridge over the Coldstream River between Ulmarra and Tucabia was built in 1908 and served the community well for more than 110 years. The upgraded bridge will allow two cars to pass and will have an increased load capacity, while keeping its historic value.

That work is progressing well and the upgraded bridge is expected to be open to traffic by February 2021, weather permitting. A temporary bridge is in operation until the upgraded bridge opens. One of the important heritage features of the bridge are the timber trusses, which were designed in the early 1900s. New timber trusses, built on site from North Coast hardwood timbers, will be installed on the rebuilt bridge.

## Traffic changes

To install the new timber trusses, **the temporary bridge over the Coldstream River will be closed from 6am, on Saturday 28 November to 8pm, on Sunday 29 November.**

Detours will be in place during this work. Alternative routes to Tucabia are available either via the Coldstream Road off the Pacific Highway at Tyndale north of Grafton or via Eight Mile Lane and Wooli Road off the Pacific Highway south of Grafton (see map of alternative routes on this page).

## How will the work affect you?

The work will involve the use of a large crane, other heavy machinery and hand tools, which generate noise. We will make every effort to minimise noise and conduct noisier activities earlier in the day.


Piling work for the rebuilt bridge has been completed, meaning the noisiest of the activities associated with the project is finished. We thank the community for its patience during this work.
