

Ongoing early work for Pacific Highway upgrade, between Ourimbah Street and Parsons Road, Lisarow until Monday 30 April

The NSW Government has provided \$9 million in 2017/18 for the planning of the Pacific Highway upgrade, between Ourimbah Street and Parsons Road, Lisarow to improve traffic flow and safety

Roads and Maritime Services continues to progress plans for the upgrade. Construction is expected to begin by the end of 2018 following a tender process.

Upcoming work

Roads and Maritime will continue to carry out early work, including relocating utilities, until Monday 30 April. Ausgrid is currently adjusting powerlines in the area around the intersections of Railway Crescent, Dora Street and the Pacific Highway.

This work involves removing existing power poles, installing new poles and relocating lines and other associated equipment. Due to the proximity of the powerlines to the road and the need to minimise the impact on local traffic, some of this work is occurring at night.

How will the work affect you?

There will be noise associated with this work. The noisiest work will be the removal of existing power poles on Railway Crescent, which will require concrete cutting and heavy vehicle movements. This activity will occur over two consecutive nights, weather permitting

- **8.00pm Friday 6 April to 5.00am Saturday 7 April**
- **8.00pm Saturday 7 April to 5.00am Sunday 8 April**

We will further notify affected residents closer to the date. Ausgrid has committed to minimise the disruption to you by, wherever possible, completing the noisiest work earlier in the evening. The remainder of the work includes the use of cranes to install new poles and workers on elevated work platforms to connect new lines and equipment. If further work is required after 30 April, we will continue to notify the community.

A map is included below to show the full work area.


Traffic changes

Partial lane closures and a reduced speed limit will be in place at times while work is carried out to ensure the safety of road users and workers. Road users are asked to follow the direction of traffic controllers, adhere to reduced speed limits and follow traffic signs.
