Princes Highway Upgrade, Kirrawee

Project update | June 2020

The NSW Government is funding this project as part of a program to ease congestion and improve travel times on Sydney's busiest corridors.

Transport for NSW is making improvements to the intersections of the Princes Highway with Kingsway, Oak Road and Acacia Road, and the intersections of Acacia Road with President Avenue to help improve traffic flow, travel times and safety for all road users.

- constructed a new retaining wall on the northern side of Princes Highway between Acacia and Oak roads, and carried out utility upgrades
- completed early works eastbound on the northern side of Princes Highway to prepare for new lanes.

Project benefits

The benefits of the improvement include:

- improved operation of Princes Highway along the corridor and at the intersections with Acacia Road, Oak Road, Kingsway and President Avenue
- improved safety at the intersections, with a reduction in the number of rear-end crashes and crashes involving motorists changing lanes
- reduced traffic delays and a better flow of traffic for motorists at all points along the corridor.

Work to date

Since work started in April 2018 we have:

- started work to upgrade the central median on Princes Highway
- moved services and relocated utilities on Princes Highway and President Avenue
- moved the median strip, relocated the traffic lights and extended turning lanes at the intersection of President Avenue and Acacia Road.
- extended the northbound right-turn slip lane on Acacia Road approaching President Avenue
- completed a new left-turn slip lane from Princes Highway onto Kingsway

What's happening next?

- Night works will continue on Princes Highway
- Completion of the retaining walls on Princes Highway
- Construction of a new southbound left-turn lane from Oak Road onto Princes Highway
- A third eastbound right-turn lane will be constructed from Princes Highway into Kingsway
- Continuation of drainage on the Princes Highway.

Our work schedule

Until **September 2020**, we will work up to **five nights** and **six days** a week, weather permitting.

Our standard night work hours will be **8pm-5am** up to five nights a week. Our daytime work hours will be **7am-6pm** from **Monday to Friday** and **8am-5pm at weekends**.

Work hours have been extended to now include Saturday afternoons and Sunday as part of a NSW Government initiative to enable effective social distancing on worksites.

Engaging with the community

To ensure we protect public health and safety during the Coronavirus outbreak, we need to change how we consult with the community.

Please be assured we will continue to respond to any questions or concerns you may have about our work.

Use of site compounds

Transport for NSW has established site compounds on the corner of The Boulevard and Wandella Road and the corner of Kingsway and Sylvania Road, both in Miranda.

Both compounds will be used for storing containers, stockpiling materials, construction vehicles, and as a site office for project staff.

Work will be shared between the two locations to reduce the impact on surrounding residents and businesses.

We will be limiting work to three nights per week per compound, and only one compound will be used on any given night. We will ensure noisy work is concluded by midnight when night work is carried out.

Work at both compound sites is scheduled to be completed in late 2020.


