

Installation of new clearways on Warringah Road from Roseville Bridge, Roseville Chase to Beacon Hill Road, Beacon Hill

Roads and Maritime Services | April 2018

The NSW Government is funding this project as part of its \$121 million Clearways Program, which aims to reduce congestion and delays on Sydney’s roads.

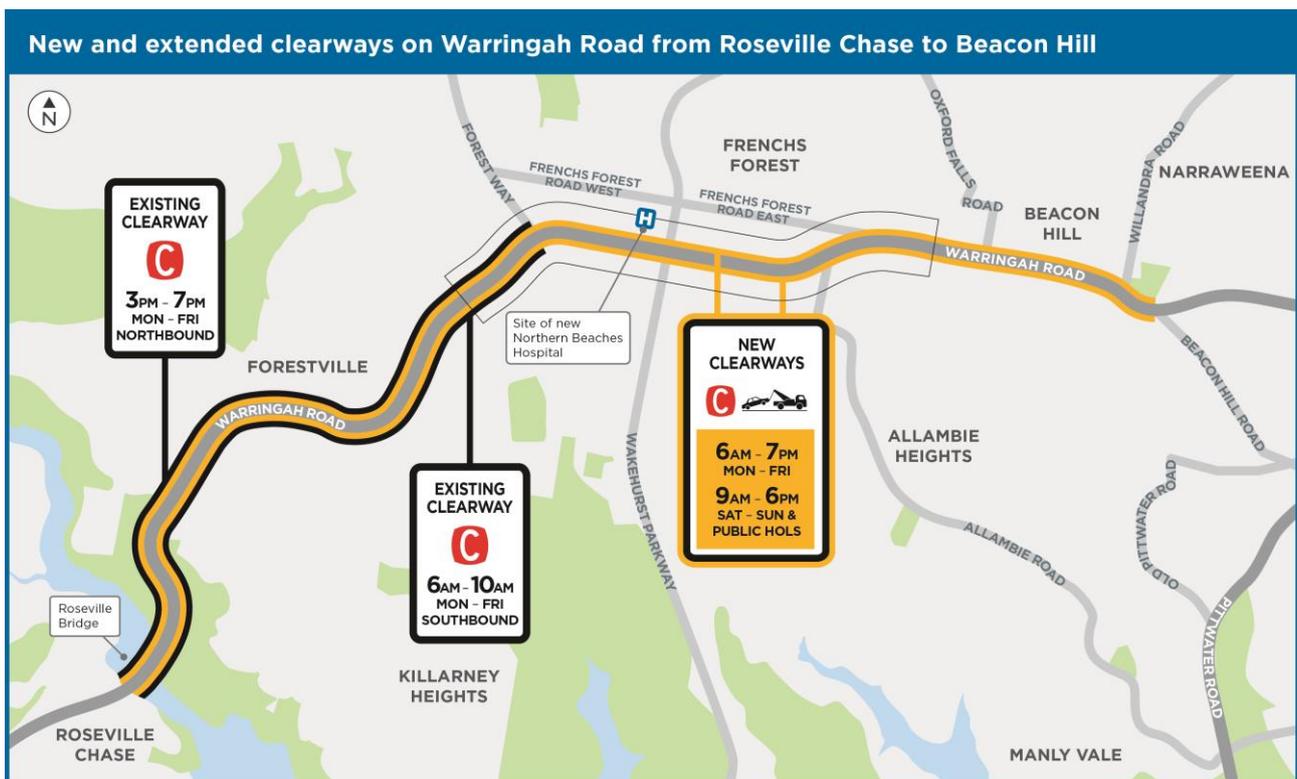
In November and December last year, Roads and Maritime Services displayed the Review of Environmental Factors (REF) for a proposal to extend the existing weekday and introduce new weekend clearways on Warringah Road between Roseville Bridge, Roseville Chase and Beacon Hill Road, Beacon Hill.

We have considered the comments received, along with the Sydney Clearways Strategy objectives and the outcomes of the traffic investigations, and have decided to progress with the proposal.

The new weekend and extended weekday clearways will be operational from **30 April**. The clearway hours in both directions on Warringah Road from Roseville Bridge to Beacon Hill Road will be:

- **weekdays from 6am to 7pm**
- **weekends and public holidays from 9am to 6pm.**

There will be no changes to existing parking restrictions outside the new clearway hours.



Changes to clearway restrictions will also be implemented on Warringah Road where the Northern Beaches Hospital road upgrade project is currently taking place.

What happens next?

The new clearway signs and posts will be installed between **16 April and 29 April**, weather permitting. Our working hours will be between **8pm and 5am** from **Monday to Sunday**.

During the installation work, there will be some temporary traffic changes to ensure the work zone is safe. Lane closures will be in place and may affect travel times. Please keep to speed limits and follow signs and traffic controllers' directions.

How will the work affect you?

There will be some noise associated with this work but we will do everything we can to minimise its impact, including completing the noisier tasks by **11pm**.

REF display outcome

We distributed over 10,000 letters to residents, businesses, and other key stakeholders advising of the display of the REF and welcomed any new comments on the project.

We received comments from 36 community members and stakeholders who mainly raised similar matters to those raised in the project consultation last year. The key matters related to the need for new and extended clearways, changes to parking, and access to properties.

We have collated the comments and provided responses to all the matters raised in a submissions report. This is available on the project website at rms.nsw.gov.au/clearways.

As a resident or visitor, what does this mean for me?

The new clearways will change the ability to park or pick up and drop off family, friends and deliveries along Warringah Road. We understand that this may cause some inconvenience to you.

If you currently live on this section of Warringah Road, you will need to reconsider where to direct your pick up and drop off during the new clearway hours. If you do not have a driveway, garage or carport on your property, local streets are available subject to council restrictions.

What is a clearway?

A clearway is a section of road where stopping and parking is not allowed during the times shown on the clearway sign. Clearways are put on key arterial roads where traffic is often heavy and congested. They help keep vehicles moving by making all lanes available to motorists. The only exception is the stopping of buses and taxis dropping off or picking up passengers as well as emergency vehicles.

If you park in a clearway during the clearway hours you risk being fined and your vehicle can be towed.

To report a vehicle parked in a clearway or if your vehicle has been towed from a clearway, please call the Transport Management Centre on 131 700.
