

Submissions reports online – proposed future upgrade of Manns Road between Stockyard Place, West Gosford and Narara Creek Road, Narara

The NSW Government is investing in a future upgrade of the three kilometre section of Manns Road between West Gosford and Narara to improve traffic flow and safety.

The upgrade forms part of a larger program to upgrade the Pacific Highway and Manns Road corridor between the Central Coast Highway at West Gosford and the M1 Pacific Motorway at Ourimbah.

In recognition of the complexity and size of this proposal, Roads and Maritime is developing the proposal in stages. The first stage involves proposed intersection and approach upgrades on Manns Road at Stockyard Place, West Gosford and Manns Road at Narara Creek Road, Narara. The upgrades would improve road safety and reduce travel times for vehicles travelling through both intersections.

Environmental assessments were carried out to identify the potential impacts of the proposed upgrades and activities to reduce them. Stakeholders and the community were invited to provide feedback on the concept designs and environmental assessments between 20 May and 14 June 2019. We would like to thank everyone who took the time to provide feedback.

Community feedback

A total of 18 submissions were received with the main concerns relating to local business access and impacts to property, as well as queries relating to the larger program to upgrade the Pacific Highway and Manns Road corridor.

Next steps

The project will now progress to detailed design. Start of construction dates are subject to funding approval.
